**Proposed Minor Relaxation of Building Height Restriction for Munsang College, Block E & adjoining areas - application no.: A/K18/314**

As the Chairperson of the Munsang College Alumni Association and still an active alumni despite graduating over 50 years ago, I have witnessed the continued contribution of Munsang in providing quality education to our students over the last few decades.

As a school that provides kindergarten, primary and secondary school education, the demand for facilities from different sections of the school has always been great. However, in the last 15 years, due to the rising need to increase the depth and breadth of our services, it has become increasingly difficult to satisfy the requirements of various school programs and activities.

The school has recently submitted for our consideration, a proposed redevelopment plan for Block E. I am pleased to submit to you that the proposed plan has the full support of our association. We view that the plan can not only upgrade aging facilities and enhance the overall learning environment, it should also allow the school to better organise classrooms and various program schedules for all three schools on our campus. While the overall student population will remain the same, the new Block E will house a new indoor swimming pool and a few multi-purpose rooms to fundamentally ease the burden of existing administrators and enable us to better serve all our stakeholders.
